We are coming up to the first anniversary of the founding of our municipality on January 1, 2023. Our first year has been an exciting, demanding and a learning experience.



WINTER PARKING

As per various bylaws, here are the parking limitations outlined for around the Campbellton Regional Community.

CAMPBELLTON AREA

- Parking restrictions in effect from November 15 until April 30.
- Parking for all vehicles prohibited on streets between midnight and 7 a.m., seven days per week.
- Exceptions: Ramsay Street, Water Street, Union Street, Subway Street and Roseberry Street (between George Street and Subway Street) where a vehicle may be parked until 2:30 a.m.
- Owners/operators of vehicles not following these restrictions will be fined and/or have their vehicle towed at their own expense.

ATHOLVILLE, VAL D'AMOURS, SAINT-ARTHUR AREAS

- Parking restrictions in effect from November 1 until April 30.
- Parking for all vehicles prohibited on streets between midnight and 7 a.m., seven days per week.
- Vehicles in contradiction to these restrictions will be towed at the owner's expense.



TIDE HEAD

- Parking restrictions in effect from November 1 until April 30.
- No parking on any street while snow removal operations are being carried out along the street.
- Vehicles in contradiction to these restrictions will be towed at the owner's expense.

SNOW CLEARING OPERATIONS

In an effort to help our municipal employees maintain our streets safe during the winter season, we ask that you please not push snow or ice onto any street or sidewalk from any lot or building. We thank you in advance for your cooperation! In order to ensure public safety, please ensure that fire hydrants are not covered with snow by you or your snow clearing contractor.



CIVIC NUMBERS

The consistent presentation of civic numbers on your property is an important way for first responders to find your address as quickly as possible. Here are guidelines to follow when installing a civic number ("street address number") on your property:



- Numbers should be on the same side of the road to the structure to which they relate.
- Numbers should, where possible, be attached in order of preference to: 1) building; 2) mailbox; and 3) civic number post.
- Numbers should face directly onto the road so that the civic number may be easily seen by vehicles travelling in both directions.
- The bottom of the numerals should be at least 1.2 metres (48 inches) above the ground or more in order to be seen during winter conditions.

- The numbers should be in numeric form (not written out).
- The colour of each numeral should contrast with the colour of the building, mailbox or sign post to which it is attached, and ideally should be constructed of a reflective material.
- If the number is located on a sign or post or on a building which is within 15 metres (49.2 feet) of the roadway, then the numerals should be not less than 65 millimeters (2 1/2 inches) in height, or preferably at the driveway entrance, and constructed of a reflective material.
- If the number is located on a building which is 15 or more metres (49.2 feet) from the roadway, then the numerals should be not less than 100 millimeters (4 inches) in height.
- An owner may place a civic number on a sign or sign post located adjacent to the entrance of a driveway which provides emergency vehicle access to a building.
- Consider traffic safety and other overruling factors that may impact the display of your civic number (i.e., obstruction due to excessive snow fall, potential damage caused by snow removal vehicles, and visibility to emergency service vehicles at night).
- Standardized address plates are available at the provincially designated local supplier: Enseignes Chaleur Signs, 2 Notre Dame Street, Atholville Area, 506-789-0790.

DESIGNATED DISABLED PARKING



Campbellton Regional Community residents and visitors are reminded that designated disabled parking spaces in the municipality are for those holding valid disabled parking permits ONLY.

These special permits are issued in situations where the person has a significant degree of mobility impairment caused by paralysis, lower limb amputation, heart or lung disease or other health problems such that the person would have difficulty walking unassisted more than 50 metres in outdoor weather conditions.

We are asking for the public's cooperation in ensuring that these parking spaces be kept available for those who need them.

Vehicles not displaying a valid disabled parking permit risk being towed or fined.
